

The Poudre School District Board of Education met for two special meetings on June 16, 2026, at the Johannsen Support Services Center. The agendas for these meetings included:

Supporting students with special needs discussion

In the first special meeting discussion, board members received a brief presentation from staff and experts working on programming for students on the autism spectrum, support for students with dyslexia, and equity for students served on IEPs meant to be considered in any future school closure or consolidation.

This was followed by a robust small-group discussion where feedback from community members was gathered.

Action Items

The board's sole discussion during the action items section of the second special meeting was the approval of the continuation of Superintendent Brian Kingsley's contract with PSD. The superintendent's salary is reviewed once each fiscal year with any adjustments to the salary being written in an addendum to the contract.

The board approved Kingsley's salary contract with a majority vote.

Informal Reports / Discussion items

The board also heard an update about comprehensive planning work that is underway. The Comprehensive Planning Committee is entering phase three of its work on potential closure and consolidation recommendations. This phase, which will run from June to October, focuses on the creation of action teams that will discuss and develop supports for transitions, should the board decide to move forward with closure/consolidation of schools. A scenario development team, which includes staff and members of the CPC, is also working to identify possible school combinations and reviewing and evaluating the impact of potential closures.

The CPC's next phase, phase four, will begin later this year when the committee presents recommendations for closure and consolidation to the Board.
