Superintendent report

During his [superintendent report](#), Brian Kingsley briefly discussed several items, including thanking Dr. Traci Gile and Brett Hansen for their continued work on the Comprehensive Planning Committee and recognizing the hard work of students and staff during CMAS testing. He also previewed some of the discussions planned for the night, including finance updates and updates on the now discontinued reduction in force process.

He also shared a video celebrating assistant principals' week.

Informal Reports / Discussion items

Chief of Staff Dr. Lauren Hooten provided a brief update on the Reduction in Force (RIF) process, which has been discontinued as the district successfully found placements for all continuing contracted teachers. However, she also acknowledged that approximately 250 individuals have been impacted in this process for next school year.

The Board also heard a [budget update](#), which has not changed significantly since the last meeting it was discussed. The presentation included information about the School Finance Act and expected impacts on the district.

Board members also unanimously approved a replacement to the Fort Collins High School tennis courts.

The Board ended the April 14 meeting in executive session, which is not open to the public.
