



JC - SCHOOL ATTENDANCE AREAS

A student's designated attendance area is determined by their residence, in accordance with Colorado law. The designated attendance area determines the student's neighborhood school. The Board of Education is responsible for approving all school attendance areas. The superintendent will recommend any proposed changes to attendance areas to the Board based on geography and student population projections. The superintendent, in consultation with the Board, may form a committee to review school attendance areas prior to a recommendation.

The District will review enrollment trends on a regular basis and recommend attendance area/boundary adjustments as needed. In establishing or adjusting school boundaries, the superintendent and/or committee will use District guidelines on building capacities, as well as other relevant data. Consideration will be given to:

- the densities of students in an area in relation to the relative capacities of the schools,
- the equalization of enrollments in classrooms,
- choice/open enrollments, and
- efficient use of transportation resources.

The District will provide for and obtain community and employee feedback on proposed boundary changes. The Board will receive a summary of the feedback along with the boundary recommendations.
