- Provides advanced learning experiences with appropriately higher learning standards.
- Provides social and emotional guidance.
- Acknowledges strengths and interests and helps the student build on them to branch out in an interdisciplinary approach.
- Applies learning to each of the Areas of Interaction of our International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme Areas of Interaction.
- Guides the student in selecting enrichment, elective, and extra-curricular opportunities.
- Lincoln Middle School's Gifted and Talented program believes in the importance of building the academic and social/emotional needs of all students through a variety of enrichment experiences in and out of the classroom.

Programming opportunities for gifted students at Lincoln:

- Grouping patterns (flexible, cluster and ability).
- Appropriate pacing through acceleration and curriculum compacting, and differentiated curriculum, instruction, and assessment.

Advanced Learning Plan process at this school



Students are placed in an advisory class with other GT students in their grade level, led by a teacher who will lead them through the ALP process. Students reflect on their learning before setting their own goals, and they have an opportunity to show their efforts and achievement at our GT presentation evening.
