O'Dea's GT Program:

- Provides advanced learning opportunities with appropriately higher learning standards.
- Provides small group pull out
- Guides the student in selecting enrichment and extra-curricular opportunities.
- O'Dea's Core Knowledge Elementary School's Gifted and Talented program believes in the importance of building the academic and social/emotional needs of all students through a variety of enrichment experiences in and out of the classroom.

Advanced Learning Plan process at this school



The Advanced Learning Plan (ALP) is developed with the student, classroom teacher and GT Site Coordinator. Parents are given opportunities for input on the ALP at any time and that process is explained at Parent/Teacher conferences in the Fall. ALP goals are established early in the school year and then revisited in January and May. Each identified student will have a goal in their area(s) of ID, as well as a social/emotional (affective) goal. When appropriate, goals can be combined to better serve a student. The GT Site Coordinator assists with monitoring the goal process.

Affective programming for GT students



Students' affective needs goals are identified in the student's Advanced Learning Plan. Depending on the student's goals, opportunities can be provided to meet them on an individual basis. Weekly instruction is provided as a class with the school counselor using the Character Strong curriculum.

Grade-specific GT services



Fifth grade advanced and gifted students concentrate on a research and presentation experience called Young Scholars. Advanced and gifted Math students use Open Up Resources for fast paced and rigorous content extension classes.

Advanced and gifted 4th graders participate in a class blog and Pixton.edu for Creative Writing and Expression, Advanced Math using Hands On Equations, Math Mates, Engage NY, Math Navigator, and Beast Academy.

Advanced and gifted 3rd graders explore reading and writing using Junior Great Books, William and Mary literature units, Open Up Resources, novel studies, Creative Writing, Advanced Math using Achieve the Core, Math Navigator, Hands On Equations and Beast Academy.

Advanced 2nd graders participate in all genres of writing using advanced Lexia CloseReads.
