Identified students participate twice a week in a pull-out enrichment time with the GT Site Coordinator, tailored towards individual learning styles, strengths and interests. During this time, the students work on book studies, research projects, higher level thinking skills, creative problem solving and other creative activities with a math or language arts focus. Students also work on social/emotional development. Bethke's GT coordinator and staff provide a responsive climate and relevant learning experiences that foster intellectual curiosity and critical and creative thinking for high student achievement. Bethke's GT Program is designed to teach students how to recognize and use their potential, and to become successful, self-directed learners.

Programming Opportunities for Gifted Learners

At grades 4 and 5, we offer a compacted math pathway for students who qualify. Qualifying students would receive 4th and half of 5th grade math standards in fourth grade and the other half of 5th and all of 6th grade math standards in fifth grade. Students qualify based on a body of evidence. Gifted students participate in various math and language arts enrichment activities i.e. novel studies, math games, research projects, etc.

Overview of the GT program at this school



Bethke's GT Program:

Students who are identified as gifted, participate twice a week in a pull-out enrichment time with the GT Site Coordinator tailored towards individual learning styles, strengths and interests. Students go during the individual grade level's scheduled blocks when no new material is being taught. During this time, the students work on book studies, research projects, higher level thinking skills, creative problem solving and other creative activities with a math or language arts focus. They will be given advanced learning experiences with appropriately higher learning standards.

Advanced Learning Plan process at this school



Students work with the GT Site Coordinator and the classroom teacher to create ALP goals for the year, reflect on them in the middle of the year and at the end of the school year. Students choose their own goals and evaluate themselves on their selected goals. These goals are a combined academic and social/emotional goal.

Enrichment opportunities for GT students during school



Students in grades 3 - 5 will have multiple times during the week to focus on math, reading, or both (depending on area of giftedness) with the GT Coordinator.

These times will focus on higher-level thinking and analysis of mathematical concepts and literature.

Affective programming for GT students
