Programming Opportunities for Gifted Learners

Third through fifth-grade students who are identified in reading will receive extension opportunities within their class and in a pull-out enrichment class taught by the gifted teacher using advanced language arts learning opportunities.

Third through fifth-grade students identified in math will receive extension opportunities within their class and in a pull-out enrichment class taught by the gifted teacher, where they will be allowed deeper exploration of math concepts.

Fifth-grade students have an opportunity to participate in the Math Olympiad.

Affective programming for GT students



The social and emotional needs of gifted students are addressed by the classroom teacher and the gifted teacher within their learning environments. The school counselor is available to address specific needs and teaches whole-group lessons within homerooms. All gifted students have an affective goal and meet with the gifted teacher to work towards those goals throughout the school year.
