# OUR PATHWAY

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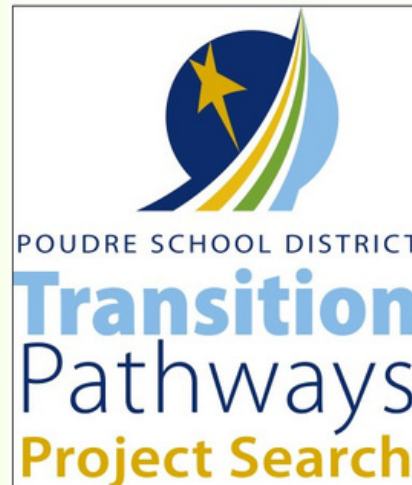
Project SEARCH is a Poudre School District Transition Pathway that collaborates with Foothills Gateway, the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, and UCHealth to provide transition-age students with disabilities the necessary skills to get paid jobs and become contributing members of their community.



# ELIGIBILITY

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- Demonstrates interest in working and maintaining employment
- Is eligible for special education services and has an IEP with transition goals
- Has completed all required academic components of school district services
- Submits a Project SEARCH application
- Applied to adult services, such as DVR and Foothills Gateway
- Is able to work independently on the job site once expectations are learned and job coaching support is provided



# PROGRAM YEAR

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Project SEARCH is a 9-month program aligned with the Poudre School District calendar. Students complete unpaid internships (16 hours per week) to develop real-world workplace skills and participate in community-based learning to explore employment, recreation, and volunteer opportunities in Fort Collins and the Northern Colorado community.
